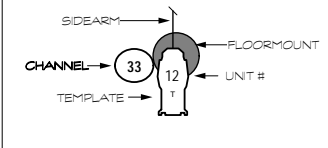

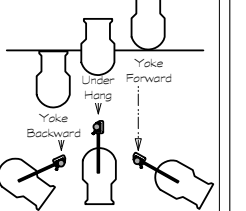

- Note: Provide talldown for 2E Unit no.1, 7'-0" below grid.
- Add RIO4 to all Ministrips- Threads Run left to right.
- Please confer with Designer if units need to be moved because of space considerations
- Please endeavor to keep cable swag to a minimum.
- Refer to hookup for accessories
